PREREQUISITES & ADMISSIONS for 180.A0

A high school diploma (D.E.S.) or equivalent and the following prerequisites are required for admission into the program:
Chemistry 534 or 551504 (Strongly Recommended)
Physical Science 436 or
Science & Technology (555404 and 558404) or (557406 and 558402)

Students accepted into the program are required to receive vaccinations prior to beginning clinical practicum in the first semester. In addition to textbooks, students are required to purchase a stethoscope, laboratory coat and nursing uniform at the beginning of the first semester.

Prerequisites at the secondary level may be obtained through a high school, an adult education centre or through Distance Education (1-877-463-3775)

OPPORTUNITIES FOR GRADUATES

Once students cross the stage and receive their CEGEP diploma, a world of opportunities awaits. Whether pursuing university studies or a career, our grads are ready to meet the challenges ahead.

Graduates of the Nursing Program are eligible to write the licensing exams administered by the Ordre des infirmiers et infirmières du Québec (examinations are in English but before a license can be granted, certain candidates may be required to pass a French-language exam). Once licensed, there are numerous career openings in health care organizations (e.g. hospitals, clinics and long-term care facilities) as well as in industry and educational settings.

Grads may continue their studies at the university level and obtain a Baccalaureate degree in Nursing. Champlain has established a DEC-BAC partnership with the Université de Sherbrooke's School of Nursing.
