

# FAQs

## - **Why should I receive a Student Involvement recognition?**

Being involved is fun, it helps you meet new people, it allows you to gain important skills, and it shows that you're a well-rounded person. On top of the personal benefits of being involved, the program is very attractive to future employers, university admission departments, and scholarship committees. Having a student involvement recognition on your transcript is one of the best ways to showcase how you get involved and contribute to your community.

## - **How do I qualify for a recognition?**

- Complete at least 60 hours in one of the categories.
- Complete your involvement hours in the designated time frame
- Be a full time student
- Be in good academic standing
- Do not receive financial compensation or academic credit for your involvement
- Have a supervisor who can verify your involvement hours that is not a relative or fellow student
- Submit your involvement form before the deadline

## - **Do I need to sign-up or inform anyone before I start accumulating involvement?**

No. You choose your own involvement and track your own hours with your supervisor. There is no need to register before beginning or completing your involvement hours.

## - **Does my involvement have to be at Champlain College Lennoxville?**

No, you're free to get involved wherever you would like. Your involvement can be at Champlain College Lennoxville, outside of Champlain College Lennoxville, or some combination of the two.

## - **Do all of my involvement hours have to be completed in the same place?**

Students may combine several activities in one area in order to accumulate 60 hours. In these cases, different sponsors may attest to the student's participation in the activities. However, an assortment of activities in different areas cannot be used to make up the 60 hours required for recognition.

## - **Do I need someone to supervise my involvement?**

Yes. All of your involvement hours must be verified by a supervisor. Supervisors cannot be fellow students or a relative. If your supervisor is a Champlain College Lennoxville staff member, they will be contacted to verify your hours. If your supervisor is from outside the college, they must complete and sign the [Involvement Supervisor Verification Form](#).

- **Can I get financial compensation or academic credit for my involvement hours?**

No, this is specifically a non-credit entry on your college transcript. This program is intended to be motivated by your own interest in being involved, and not out of any academic or financial motivation.

- **Can I receive Student Involvement recognition in more than one category in a semester?**

Yes, if you have done 60+ hours in multiple categories in one semester, you can submit your involvement hours to receive recognition in multiple categories. Note that you can only apply once per category per semester.

- **Can I receive a Student Involvement recognition in more than one semester?**

Yes, you can apply for a recognition in as many semesters as you are a full-time student at Champlain College Lennoxville! You can even apply in the same category as a previous semester.

- **When do I submit my involvement hours into the online form to receive Student Involvement recognition?**

You can submit your involvement hours to [Student Services](#) before the announced deadline, as soon as you have finished all of your hours for the semester.

- **Where do I see my Student Involvement recognition?**

This is a non-credit entry on your official Champlain College Lennoxville transcript. For this reason, the recognition is only visible on your official transcript which comes from the Registrar's Office (the one sent to universities and employers). You will not be able to see it if you view your transcript online.

- **When will I find out if my Student Involvement recognition is approved?**

Recognitions are awarded only after the final grades have been submitted and once each submission has been processed. You will be contacted by MIO a few weeks after each semester to let you know if your application has been approved or if there were any issues.
